Birdwatchers set new record

Some people throw Frisbees to break records and others count birds. On Friday, four students set a new Oregon record for the most birds observed during one day.

Friday's record of 157 species topped the previous record of 142 species set on May 1 of this year. The bird marathon started at Florence at 3:30 a.m. and ended 450 miles later at Malheur Wildlife Refuge in eastern Oregon at 9 p.m. The national record is held by a California group that observed 201 species in one big day. The world record is 288 species reported in one day in Zambia.

Participants in the marathon were George "Chip" Jobanek and Alan Contreras, University students, Micheal Patterson of Oregon State University and Sayre Greenfield of Cornell University.

The rules for the marathon, established by the American Birding Association (ABA), require that all par-

ticipants stay within conversational distance and that they attempt to identify the reported species.

The first bird reported Friday was a Swainson's Thrush at Florence. The group then traveled up to Yachats for the sunrise and the typical coastal species. Coastal species observed included rhinoceros auklets, tufted puffins, pigeon guillemots, and black oyster catchers.

From the coast the bird watchers proceeded up the Siuslaw River to Eugene, observing such species as the osprey, mountain quail, and pileated woodpecker. By the time the group reached Eugene at 10:30, they had tallied 95 species, including a screech owl on campus.

They proceeded up the McKenzie River to Bend and from there across the desert to Burns and the Malheur Wildlife Refuge. Chip Jobanek noted that the desert section proved to be quite rewarding, as they observed golden eagles, burrowing owls, a prairie falcon, a sage thrasher, and a horned lark. The last species they observed was a white-faced ibis.

In addition to the two bird marathons, May was a good month for Oregon birders as several new records and sightings were established. In May, a chestnut-collared longspur was sighted at Fern Ridge Reservoir west of Eugene. It is normally found east of the Rockies. On May 15, a Louisiana Heron was found at Finley Wildlife Refuge near Corvallis. Its normal range is the Gulf Coast and Baja Peninsula salt-water marshes.

A group of birders turned up a northern parula at Malheur on May 29. It is an eastern warbler rarely found west of the Mississippi River. White-tailed kites, a California raptor, were observed mating at Finley in late May. If they nest successfully, it will be the first such occurrence in the state.

Increasing observations of unusual birds indicate that Oregon may be just as attractive to California birds as it is to California people, states one local birdwatcher. And that means next year's bird marathon could even break this year's record.
