

Paulus campaigns at theater benefit

State Rep. Norma Paulus, R-Salem, the Republican candidate for secretary of state, stopped in Eugene Friday to attend a campaign fundraiser performance of "The Sunshine Boys" at Eugene's Valley River Inn.

"I consider myself a McCall Republican," Paulus said, and sized up her campaign against State Sen. Blaine Whipple, D-Beaverton, as a "real horse race."

"For the first time since Vietnam and Watergate people between ages 18 and 25 want to get involved, register and participate in politics again," says Paulus. "But they're registering as Independents because they can't identify with either major party."

Paulus clashes sharply with Whipple over solutions to this problem. She advocates an "open primary," allowing Independents a chance to vote in either the Democratic or Republican primaries. Whipple opposes the concept.

"We have 103,000 registered Independents in Oregon and we'll have 150,000 by election day," Paulus claimed. "That's a significant block of voters who can't vote in primaries. Let's be honest about our system. Let's give them the vote."

On governmental reform,

Paulus emphasized the need for a "Sunset" law that would force agencies to justify their existence every two years, before the Legislature, or have their agency terminated. "It would promote," she said, "a cleaner, leaner, more responsive government in Oregon."

Paulus touched on several ballot measures, including Ballot Measure No. 7 concerning public financing of campaign races, which she opposes.

"It's a taxpayer rip-off," she argued. "Candidates should be elected on the basis of their own qualifications for office, not by public tax money used to build up their own name familiarity."

On Ballot Measures No. 10 and 12 regarding state land-use planning, Paulus reiterated her strong opposition to any repeal, saying, "I've voted for every land-use bill in the Legislature in my six years as a representative."

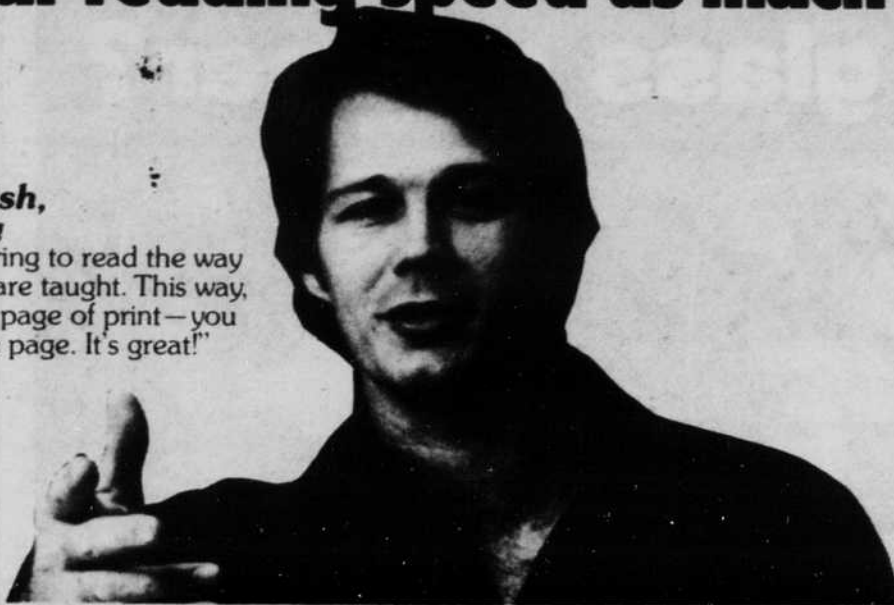
