

No Irish luck for Oregon as ND romps

SOUTH BEND, Ind. — Notre Dame showed that it's as strong as ever, and Oregon showed that it's still trying to find an offense as the fourteenth-ranked Irish blanked the Ducks 41-0 Saturday.

If was the fourth straight game that Notre Dame hasn't allowed a touchdown in as the Irish defense riddled Oregon for more than three quarters.

For starters, Notre Dame out-rushed Oregon 306-0 thanks to seven sacks of starting quarterback Jack Henderson for minus-56 yards. Oregon didn't even get a first down until late in the second quarter, and didn't reach Notre Dame territory until sophomore Rick Washut came in off the bench in the fourth quarter.

While Notre Dame, now 4-1, was holding Oregon to just 149 total yards, the Irish

offense pulled a few surprises to get on the board.

Midway through the first quarter, freshman receiver Dave Waymer threw a pass off an end-around play to Dan Kelleher, who was knocked out at the Oregon one-yard-line. Quarterback Rick Slager snuck in on the next play to give the Irish all the points they needed.

Notre Dame scored on its next series after a 31-yard punt by Rick Geiger. Terry Eurick ran nine yards to the Oregon 14, and after a short run to the 11, Slager threw to Mark McLane for a touchdown.

Oregon was thrown off guard by Notre Dame's passing as the usually run-dominated team was 16 of 26 for 213 yards.

The Irish used the pass to pour it on in the second quarter. Another short punt gave the hosts the ball in Oregon territory early in

the period. Slager threw to McLane for 15 yards and McAfee for 13 to carry the ball to the Duck 14. A couple plays later, halfback Al Hunter ran nine yards for the score to give the Irish a 20-0 lead.

Hunter's seven-yard touchdown run on Notre Dame's next series gave the Irish a 27-0 halftime lead to help drop Oregon's record to 3-3.

Oregon couldn't muster any offense until the fourth quarter when Washut took over for Henderson, who re-injured his finger. Washut hit Greg Bauer for 16 and 14 yards to the Irish 45, and then found Ken Page for 21 yards to the Irish 18. He then hit Dave Miller at the eight, but the tight end was hit by Mike Banks and fumbled to safety Joe Restic.

In one quarter of action, Washut was 7 of 16 for 96 yards.

Oregon hits the road again next Saturday as it faces Washington, also with a 3-3 record.

Oregon's next game is Wednesday, as it travels to Corvallis for a 4 p.m. game against Oregon State.

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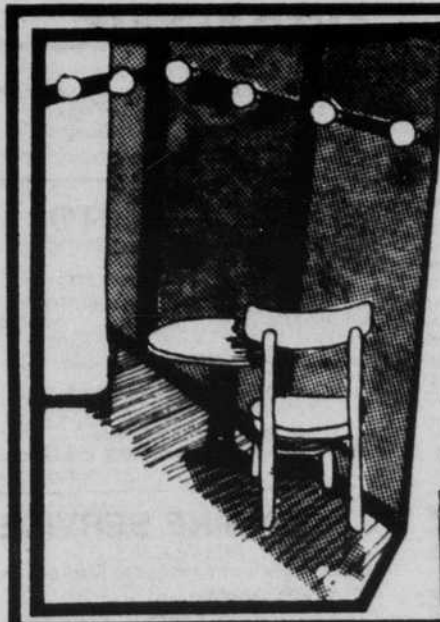
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
