## Jail bond levy story amended

Contrary to a report in the Oct. 20 issue of the Emerald, the Lane County Jail proposal will create a 206-person capacity jail, and will include work-education release programs.

The proposal, an \$8.9 million bond levy, which will be before the voters in November's election, calls for a new building to be attached to the existing jail. The new facility will house three dormitory cells of 12-person capacity each, a new visitors center, a mental health unit, an outdoor exercise area and new kitchen facilities.
