The atlas was a three-year project of the University's geography department. Along with 740 maps, the atlas contains facts ranging from the territory of each of the state's Indian tribes to an analysis of Oregon voters in all presidential elections since 1912.

Poison weed warning posted

The Drug Information Center has received reports of Eugene High School students experimenting with a common plant with a high potential for poisoning.

The herb, known locally as thornapple, jimson weed, Jamestown weed and stinkweed contains chemicals which even in moderate doses can produce highly toxic effects. The plants are being promoted as an Hawaiian hallucinogen.

Although awaiting confirmation from the State Medical Examiner, it is thought that ingestion of thornapple/jimson weed seeds was the cause of death of one girl, and necessitated the hospitalization of four other students in Roseburg, Oregon, last week.
