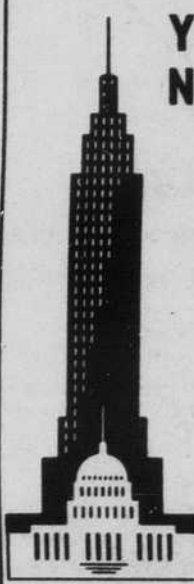

The 1976 tour offers skiing one week each in Kitzbuehel, Austria (the Alps) and picturesque Canazei, Italy (the Dolomites), plus two days in Munich. The \$789 price includes airfare, accommodations, breakfasts, dinners, transfers, sightseeing, ski lectures, parties, sight-seeing, and farewell dinner at the Lowenbrau Brewery in Munich.

Two units of undergraduate or graduate credit in physical education are available from the University of Nevada, Reno, transferable to other colleges.
