The workshop will focus on "tools" that are being developed for describing and resolving land use conflicts.

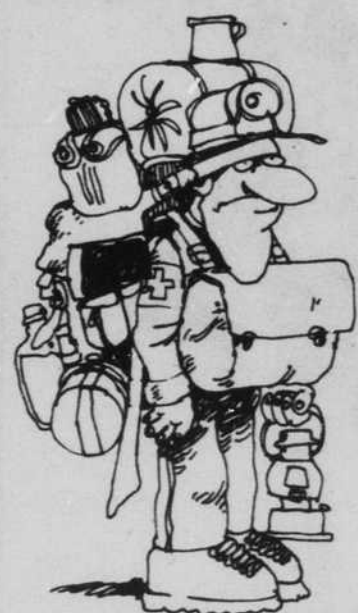
