

## Housing offers requested

Off-Campus Housing hopes to alleviate this problem by developing a list of emergency housing options. ## American Indian Women's Club forms

The American Indian Women's Club of Eugene and Springfield has received its incorporation papers and is planning activities for December.

The elected officers of the club will be announced at a Dec. 1 meeting scheduled for 12:30 p.m. at the Indian Longhouse. Members will also plan a potluck to be held Dec. 10. All Indian women may attend the meeting and bring their ideas for the club.

The main goal of the club is to establish an emergency house in the Eugene or Springfield area. The house would provide a place for Indian women to identify with other American Indian people. It would also provide such services as temporary shelter, food, clothing, referral health care and serve as a meeting place for social activities such as potlucks, arts and crafts displays and Indian dancing.

The emergency house would

also be used for Indian students who come from various parts of the country and who need help finding a place to live and referral services to education facilities.

Club board members include Marilyn Woodbridge, club coordinator; Roberta Conners, ASUO director; Sharon Shuey, director of the Native program in Eugene; Lucy La Claire of the Eugene Nursing Association and Sydney Gaboriault, secretary and active member.

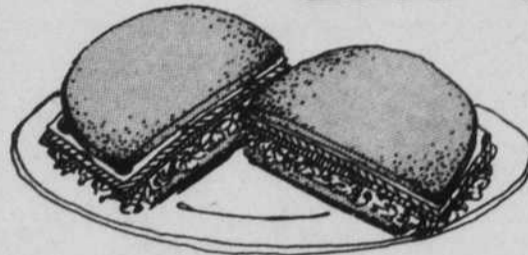
### AV FILMS
