More than 50,000 persons were left homeless after the Nov. 24 earthquake in eastern Turkey and UNICEF is seeking donations in the Eugene area to provide relief.

Evelyn McConnaughey, UNICEF volunteer, said the organization has provided warm clothing for 25,000 children.
