

Stage set for electoral college vote

WASHINGTON (AP) — The much maligned but never seriously disturbed electoral college meets on schedule today in 50 states and the District of Columbia to elect Jimmy Carter of Georgia as President of the United States.

Under the Constitution, the Electoral College, the group which really elects presidents no matter what the voter may think, meets

on the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December. That's today.

The meetings take place in the state capitals and the results will be sent to Washington, where the certificates will be opened by Vice-Pres. Nelson Rockefeller on Jan. 6 before a joint session of Congress.

If the electors follow the script, Carter will get the 297 electoral

votes he won in the Nov. 2 election, and Pres. Ford will get the other 241. The Rockefeller will declare Carter the Pres.-elect.

The last suspense was taken out of the electoral ceremony Thursday when federal judges in Ohio and Texas refused to sign orders to stop Carter electors from meeting in those states.

The Ohio challenge had been filed by Republican, American and

U.S. Labor Party members who charged the election there was marred by fraud. Two independent voters in Texas had complained that they were denied the right to vote for candidates other than those on the ballot.

Although the electoral vote victory for Carter was one of the closest in recent history, the college appears to have survived another election.
