

In mail-in balloting held in December, the 11,000-member American Association of Teachers of German elected Diller to a three-year term of office as its president. The organization's national offices are in Philadelphia.

Notary services available

Notary Public services now are available to University faculty, staff and students free of charge at two campus locations.

Patt Olson, EMU secretary, will act as notary during EMU office hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Her office is located in Room 101 on the mezzanine floor of the EMU.

James Williams, manager, and Judith Johnson, office manager of the University Bookstore, provide their notary services Monday through Friday from 8:15 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Labels ease tax refunds

Taxpayers can receive their refunds faster by using the pre-addressed, peel-off label on their returns, said Ralph Short, district director of Internal Revenue Service for Oregon.

The label is located on the cover of the tax package mailed to all taxpayers who filed income tax returns last year. Short said if any information on the label is incorrect, the taxpayer should cross out the incorrect information and make the correction on the label.

Married taxpayers filing a joint return should check to see that two social security numbers are on the label. If only one social security number is shown, the other spouse's number should be entered on the appropriate line.

Taxpayers also can insure a faster refund by mailing their return in the coded pre-addressed envelope included with the tax package.

Federal income tax information is available statewide by telephone. The Eugene information number is 485-8285.

To request federal tax forms, call either 1-800-452-1996 or 221-3933 (Portland area), the special IRS toll-free telephone lines.

Federal income forms are available at most banks and post offices and at all IRS offices.

IRS taxpayer service representatives are on duty in Eugene from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday at 211 E. Seventh Ave. These office hours are scheduled through April 15, the final day for filing federal income tax returns for most taxpayers.

Domestic tips offered

A Spanish language newsletter entitled "For Young Homemakers" now is available free of charge through the Lane County Extension Service.
