

Men win Relays

Oregon's men swimmers capitalized all comers in the Oregon Relays Saturday at Leighton Pool, racking up nine of 10 first-places for a total score of 150, 40 more than their nearest opponent.

The Duck women, however, paced Pacific Lutheran stroke-for-stroke up to the final event until PLU nudged out the Ducks for first-place with 104 total points to Oregon's 100.

In diving, John Lloyd qualified for the nationals in the one-meter diving with a 466.85, and also won the three-meter with a 443.20. Freshman Sam Nixon placed second on both boards with a 359.10 and 399.85, respectively.

Even though the women were

disqualified in the 200-butterfly relay and might have won the Oregon Relays with that event, women's coach Virginia Van Rossen still remained optimistic.

"I'm really pleased because I'm not sure we would be ready at this point. By the end of the month, we'll give them (PLU) a good match," she said.

Women gymnasts finish on top

Oregon sophomore Wendy Halberg won three events and took all-around honors to pace the Ducks to a team victory in a triangular gymnastics meet Saturday with Oregon State and Portland State.

Oregon scored 121.45 to OSU's 110.65 and PSU's 87.50.

Halberg, a graduate of Eugene's Sheldon H.S., captured firsts in vaulting (8.4), balance beam (8.6) and uneven bars (8.4) and totaled 33.00 to win the all-around competition, ahead of OSU's Donna Southwick (32.00) who won the floor exercise (8.35).

Southwick, the 1976 national junior college all-around champion, had the misfortune of breaking the lower bar during her next-to-last move on the uneven bars. She scored 8.0 for the event, although she did not complete her dismount and waived a chance to repeat the routine.

The cold temperature inside McArthur Court con-

tributed to some sub-par performances, according to both coaches and athletes.

"It's hard to stay warm in here," commented Halberg after her final event, adding that she was "medium to happy" about her performances.

Oakland finally wins the big one

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Ken Stabler directed an Oakland attack that set a Super Bowl offensive record, keyed by Clarence Davis' 137 yards rushing, as the Raiders destroyed the Minnesota Vikings 32-14 Sunday.

The victory in Super Bowl XI was Oakland's first National Football League championship in two tries. For the frustrated Vikings, it was the fourth loss in as many appearances.

A record Super Bowl crowd of 100,421 jammed the Rose Bowl Stadium to watch the Raiders pick the Vikings apart with slashing runs by Davis and pinpoint passing by Stabler that left the Minnesota defense helpless.

The Raiders produced 429 yards in total offense, smashing the Super Bowl record of 358 set by Vince Lombardi's Green Bay Packers in the very first Super Bowl a decade ago.

Oakland, champion of the American Football Conference, moved through the Viking defen-

ders almost at will, with Davis chewing up high chunks of yardage and Stabler throwing only when he had to and completing almost all of the vital ones.

Stabler passed for one touchdown, Pete Banaszak ran for two others and Fred Biletnikoff caught two key passes of 17 and 48 yards that set up touchdowns.

Oakland bunched 16 points in the second quarter and, when the Vikings threatened a late comeback, the Raiders wrapped up the game with a pair of fourth-quarter TDs. The first one was set up by a 48-yard pass from Stabler to Biletnikoff; the final score came

on a 75-yard interception return by cornerback Willie Brown.

Brown's return was a Super Bowl record and it was an appropriate conclusion to the wipeout of the Vikings. The Oakland defense did almost as much to build this victory as the Raider offense.

The announced turnstile count of the crowd of 100,421 was somewhat puzzling in light of the perfect Southern California weather-clear skies and temperature in the 60s. Super Bowl officials said all 103,424 tickets had been sold so that meant there actually were 3,003 no-shows for America's most popular sports event.
