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Huskies, Alaska drop Oregon

When can two losses be construed as a positive step forward? It can in the case of Coach Elwin Heiny's Oregon women's basketball team, when those two losses come in close games with a pair of the finest women's teams in the West. The Ducks dropped a 77-67 decision to unbeaten Washington Friday and a 74-68 verdict to the University of Alaska-Fairbanks Saturday.

In each instance, the Ducks, now 1-2 on the year, were pitted against much more touted and talented foes. But in each of their games at McArthur Court, Heiny's Ducks showed they are not to be taken lightly as has been the situation in past years.

Although the Ducks were in excellent position to win both games, and showed marked improvement since their disastrous exhibition tilt with the visiting Australian All-Stars, Coach Heiny was only pleased with his squad's efforts in one game.

"I thought we didn't play well against Alaska," she said. "We should have won the game. We didn't perform. We played better against Washington."

Against the Huskies, the Ducks did indeed play well and although they never led, they were always within striking distance until Washington picked up some easy buckets in the final minute against Oregon's press.

Cathy Aiken hit 7 of 14 shots and collected 17 points in leading

the Duck showing. Aiken was particularly tough in the second half as the Ducks tried to rally from a 38-33 halftime deficit.

For a time it appeared as though the unbeaten Huskies would finally do away with the inexperienced Ducks. But the pesky hoopers wouldn't die and trailing 57-45, rode the shooting eye of Aiken and Margaret Bonn to draw within 57-54. The margin stayed in that vicinity until Janis Kendrick broke loose for a pair of cherry pick lay-ins with less than a minute to go to ice the contest for Washington.

The next night against Alaska, the Ducks were again in a prime position to cop their second win of the young season until the inexperienced Ducks ran out of gas down the stretch.

Alaska, paced by the game's

high scorer Gina Howard, dominated play for the first 10 minutes of the latter half. Then Aiken and Julie Cushing triggered a Duck comeback which erased a 63-54 Nanook lead and bolted Oregon in front 66-63 with only six minutes left. At that point, the Ducks succumbed to Alaska's experience and toughness and were outscored 11-2 down the stretch.

PORTLAND—Portland State's Dennis Jossi and Mike Wagner won the last two matches of the night to lead the Vikings to a 22-18 win over 15th-ranked Oregon, Friday night.

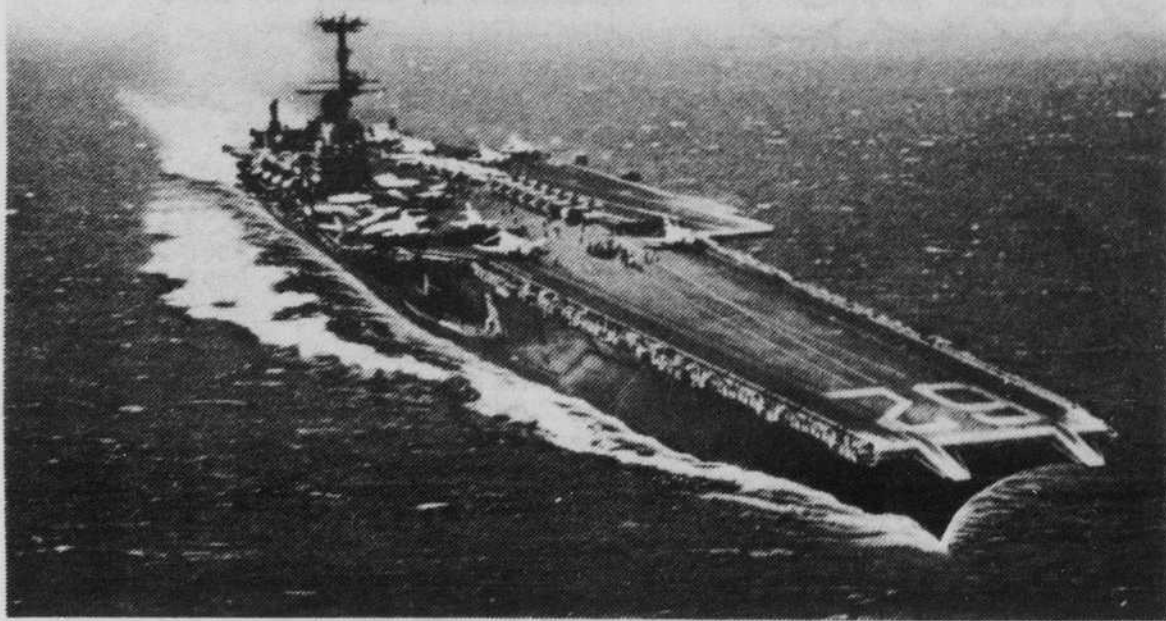
Jossi defeated Oregon's Brian Dunagan 5-4 at 190 pounds, and Wagner won by default over Terry Shanley in the heavyweight classification.

The Ducks, now 7-2 on the year, won five matches against PSU. Steve Hart remained undefeated at 9-0 as he pinned the Vikings' Ken Wong at 118 pounds.

Dewey Travis downed Terry Farley 9-6 at 126 pounds, Kevin Kramer beat Bob Hulin 8-4 at 158, Tim Strobel stopped Pete Lucas 6-3 at 167 and Buck Davis improved to 9-1 with a 7-3 win over Dann Williamson at 177.

Oregon will go on the road this week as it faces Cal State-Bakersfield Wednesday, Cal Poly - San Luis Obispo Thursday, Fresno State Friday and British Columbia and California Saturday. The meet with UBC will be in Berkeley and will precede the contest with California.

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
