The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB) will challenge representatives of Weyerhaeuser Corporation to respond to charges of intervention and complicity in the apartheid system of South Africa today at 1 p.m. at Susan Campbell Hall.

Weyerhaeuser recruiters will be interviewing prospective employees with "non-technical Bachelor of Arts degrees." The RSB plans to raise questions

about Weyerhaeuser's holdings in South Africa and other countries with repressive governments.

## Vets to receive state aid

Veterans planning to use state educational aid benefits to attend school this winter should immediately contact their school registrar or veterans' counselor, a county service officer or the Department of Veterans' Affairs, H.C. Saalfeld, Veterans' Affairs Director, has announced. Application must be made before the end of the term to receive benefits.

Korean war veterans and recipients of the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal or the Vietnam Service Medal are eligible. In addition, the veteran must have been an Oregon resident for one year prior to military service, must be an Oregon resident upon application and must have served 90 days or more during wartime or after July 1, 1958.

The benefit pays \$50 for each month of full-time undergraduate or associate degree studies and up to \$35 a month for other studies. The benefit is based on one month's entitlement for each month of military service, up to 36 months. A veteran cannot draw

state benefits for studies while receiving federal VA training benefits.
