

Child care bill pushed

A proposed state-subsidized child care bill currently being considered by the state Legislature will make "the state's commitment to child care more consistent," according to Rep. Mary Burrows, R-Eugene, co-sponsor of the bill.

Burrows, along with ASUO Pres. Jan Oliver, held a press conference in the EMU Wednesday. Both will attend a workshop on the child care bill at the EMU at 7 Thursday

night to inform people on how they can effectively push for passage of the bill.

The proposed measure, Senate Bill 389, is concerned primarily with expanding the eligibility requirements of existing child care aid to students, Burrows said.

Currently rules restrict eligibility to students enrolled in a two-year program and attending school on a full-time basis. Students at four-year institutions are eligible for

aid only during their junior and senior years.

Burrows emphasized that the purpose of the \$3.75 million bill is to supplement existing aid offered by the state's Children's Service Division. Day care grants would be part of a student's financial aid package. The State Scholarship Commission would administer the aid and would make each student's payment directly to the day care institution.
