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'Union Maids' recalls rebels of labor drives

"Union Maids," a film relating the life stories of three Chicago women who were rank and file militants in the organizing drives of the 1930s, will be shown Sunday and Monday nights on campus.

The film is sponsored by the Willamette Valley chapter of the New American Movement. Sunday's showing will be at 7:30 and 9 p.m. in 123 Science. On Monday, the film will be shown at 7:30 and 9 p.m. in 110 Fenton. Childcare will be provided both nights and admission to the film is \$1.

"Union Maids" was made by Julia Reichert and James Klein who also made one of the first and most widely seen feminist films, "Growing Up Female," and the documentary, "Methadone: An American Way of Dealing."

The "Union Maids" includes stills from the period and interviews with the women. The sound track includes classic union songs and blues and features the music of Pete Seeger and the Almanac Singers.
