The concert will be the second in a series of three performances of modern percussion-ensemble works being presented on cam-

pus this year.

The broadcast will begin at 10 a.m. on KWAX-FM, 91.1.

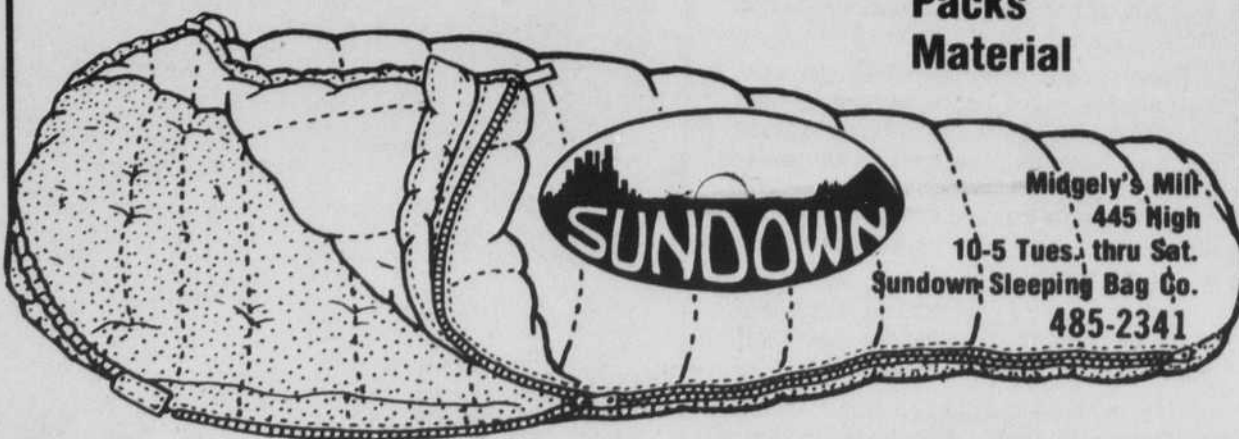
