Youth sports program open for summer

Registrations are now being accepted for the University's summer sports program for area youths.

The program, conducted as a community service by the University's College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation since 1953, is open to boys 8 to 13 years old and girls ages 6 to 13 who live in the Eugene-Springfield area.

The boys' sports program will offer activities in baseball, swimming, gymnastics, basketball, track and field, wrestling, soccer, golf and handball. Participants will spend three afternoon hours daily, Monday through Fridays, in supervised sports participation.

The girls' sports program offers three hours of activity mornings Monday through Friday. Planned activities will include swimming, gymnastics, track and field, games, rhythms and folk dance for younger groups and soccer, basketball and archery for older groups.

Both programs will run from June 20 through Aug. 5. Cost for participation is \$85.
