Red Cross aquatics set for summer term

The University has been selected as the location for a Red Cross National Aquatic School the week of June 12 through 18, according to Pat Lance, Water Safety Chair of the Lane County Red Cross.

Aquatic schools are offered at various locations across the United States each spring and summer. They certify graduates as instructors in Adaptive Aquatics for the handicapped, Lifesaving, Water Safety and Basic Swimming. More courses are offered in competitive swimming and coaching, facilities management for pool operators, standard and advanced first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

Upon successful completion of the school, students will be certified as Red Cross instructors who are equipped to teach in school and community programs. The courses are considered valuable for those interested in becoming camp counselors, waterfront directors, lifeguards or recreation supervisors.

Don Van Rossen, University head swimming coach, said few schools are capable to host this national program. It speaks well for the University, he added.

Students will be housed in dormitories, and the fee for room, board and instructional materials will be \$90. Residents of the area who would prefer living at home will be able to receive a reduced registration fee.

For an additional cost, students also may register for University credit.

The week will be an intensified one, Van Rossen said, with each day running from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Layton and Gerlinger pools will be used, and group events will be held at Dexter Lake. Sailing, canoeing and picnicking are planned as part of the week's social and educational activities.

To qualify for the school, students must be at least 17 years old, better than average swimmers and medically approved as physically fit.

The Lane County Red Cross Chapter is asking persons to fill out "Intent to Enroll" forms to begin the enrollment process. For more information, contact the office, 150 E. 18th Ave., 344-5244.
