 Today his compositions have been performed by dance companies and solicited for films. With over fifty albums to his credit, Mingus has received many honors including Downbeat Magazine Man of the Year, 1964; Ellington Medal from Yale University, 1974 and the Newport Jazz Festival 1976 Hall of Fame.
