

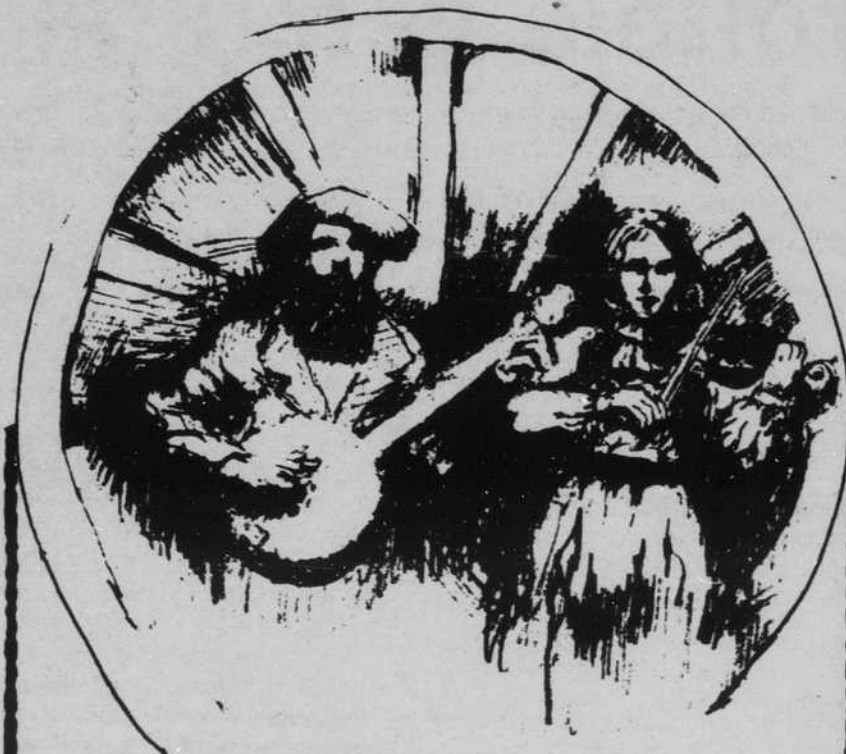
## Cooking class offered

Poet John Ashbery, winner of three national literary awards in 1976 for his book, "Self Portrait in a Convex Mirror," will deliver a free public reading of his poetry at 8 tonight in the Gerlinger Alumni Lounge.

Ashbery, professor of creative writing at Brooklyn College and visiting lecturer this spring at the University of California at Irvine, won the National Critics Circle Award, the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award in 1976 for his book of poetry. In addition, Ashbery has written plays and has co-authored a novel, "Nest of Ninnies," with James Schuyler.
