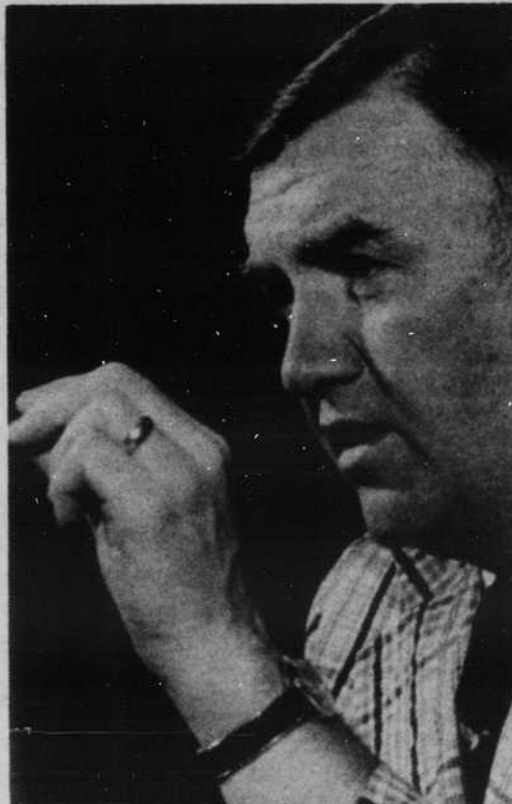
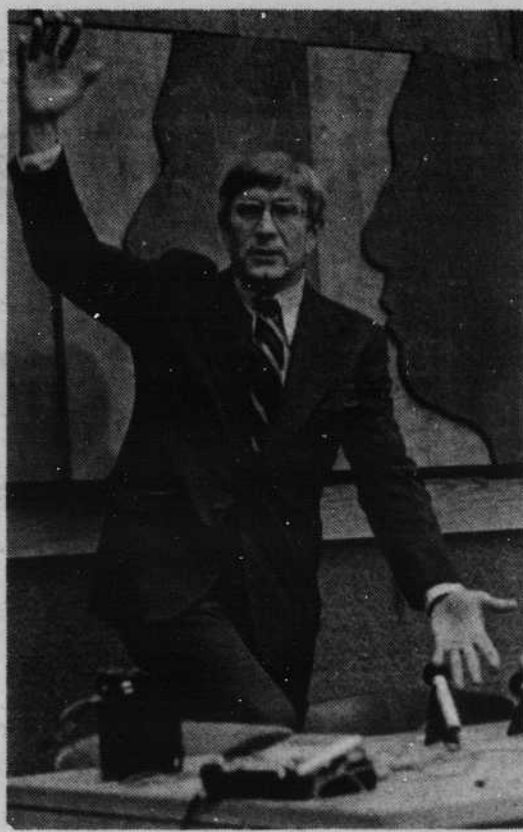
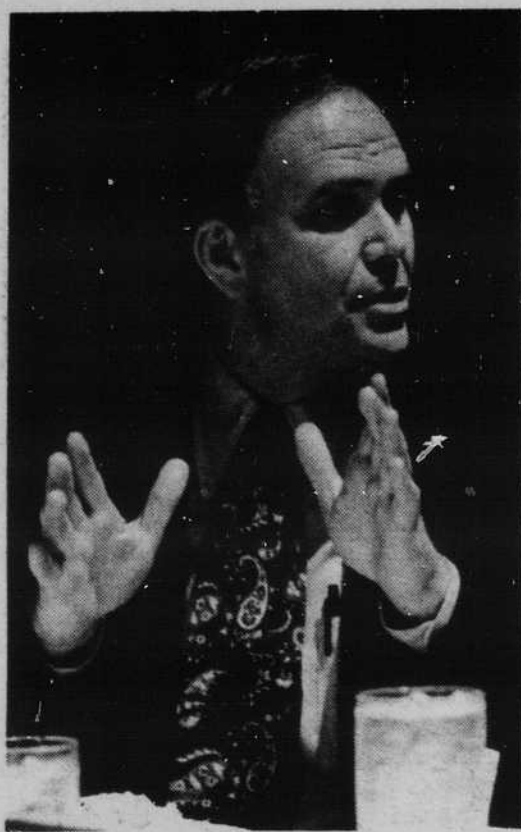

Frat members head Macho Week competition

Luscious Washington won the First Annual Voluminous Member Competition which kicked off activities for Macho Week continuing through next Wednesday on campus.

A special celebrity panel of judges rated the fifty-odd contestants in the competition. Judges included Sen. Bob Packwood, former New York Congresswoman Bella Abzug, University English professor Mas'ud Zavar-

zadeh, Congressman Jim Weaver and Eugene Police Chief Pierce Brooks. Another judge, psychology professor Ray Hyman declined to participate citing "obvious Freudian contradictions."

Macho Week is being jointly sponsored by the University Men's Center, the Interfraternity Council and the Athletic Department.

Lou Ferrari, director of the Men's Center, said the week's activities will include panel discussions, slide presentations, films and lectures. He added that an art exhibit featuring the works of male

artists from this area and across the country will be on display in the EMU throughout the week. Ferrari said the week's activities will be climaxed with a lecture presentation by internationally recognized macho figure Clint Eastwood.

Eastwood, a former logger in the Northwest who went on to become Number One Box Office Mumbler will speak on "Packing a Rod: How It Got Me From Choker Setter to Jet Setter." Eastwood will also show film clips of some of his greatest macho scenes. Eastwood's presentation is set for Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the

EMU Ballroom.

Tonight at 8 in Room 167 of the EMU, Harvey Beach, managing editor of STUD magazine will talk on the status of the masculinist movement in the United States.

A panel discussion entitled "Projecting the Macho Image On Campus: Struttin' Your Stuff" will be held Monday at 1 p.m. in the EMU Forum. A number of local macho experts will participate in the discussion. Panel members include Lance Whitepants, president of the SAEs; football star Brock "Crazy Leg" Adamson, Doug Slack, organizer of the first "Wet T-Shirt Night" in the EMU Fishbowl (to be held next week); and Kam Long Dong, president of the University's Martial Arts Society.

Dr. Riley Carrithers, masculinist and political activist from the University of Texas will present a

slide-lecture on the current status of the masculinist movement in the Middle East. Dr. Carrithers has just returned from that area after completing a three month study on the interaction of government policy and masculinity. His talk is set for 7:30 p.m. in Room To Be Posted.

Ferrari said the purpose of Macho Week is to focus the attention of the University and the community on the plight of the male sex.

"We are the largest minority in the United States and this fact is largely ignored in this country. It's through activities like Macho Week that we hope to drive this issue right down America's throat."

Ferrari said that all events of the week are free and open to the public. He added that women are also invited to attend.

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
