Planning rates change

A new fee schedule for Lane County Health Division family planning services will begin Saturday to comply with mandated federal, state and welfare requirements.

The new fees will be based on a standard charge for services modified according to the patient's income and family size. Currently, fees are based on flat rates and yearly services.

Patients of the county's family planning services may request an explanation for the new fee schedule at their next clinic visit. Those patients who have previously paid a fee will not be charged for contraceptive supplies until their next exam.

Family planning services include physical examinations, laboratory tests, contraceptive supplies and vasectomies. Any person may make an appointment for confidential birth control services.

TV cable hearings to air

Teleprompter, the local cable TV station, will air highlights of U.S. Senate hearings into cable television on four consecutive evenings, beginning Monday. The tapes, which cover three full sessions of the Subcommittee on Communications held last summer, have been divided into one-hour segments and will run from 6 to 7 p.m. on KOZY, Cable Channel 11.

The public service presentation is a co-operative effort among Home Box Office, 350 cable system af-

filates, Cablevision Magazine and Service Electric Cable TV — a Pennsylvania cable system that volunteered its technical staff and equipment to prepare the tapes.
