Jackie Onassis upset over book

BOSTON (AP) — Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis is "extremely upset" by the publication of a novel about a fictional assassination attempt against Sen. Edward Kennedy, according to an aide of the widow of the assassinated Pres. John F. Kennedy.

The book is being published by Viking Press where Onassis is a consultant-editor.

"She was never consulted on the matter," Nancy Tuckerman, an aide to the former first lady, said Wednesday.

"She was extremely upset at the time and she is upset now at published reports that she would condone the efforts of any author who would write such a book," said Tuckerman. "Her arrangement as a consultant-editor at Viking does not give her veto over books purchased by other Viking editors."

The Boston Globe reported earlier that Thomas Guinzburg, president of Viking Press, said Onassis did not object to publication of "Shall We Tell the President?"

The novel involves a fictional conspiracy to assassinate Edward Kennedy who, in the book, becomes president in 1981.

Kennedy's brother and Onassis' first husband, Pres. John Kennedy was assassinated in 1963. Sen. Robert Kennedy, another brother of the late president, was assassinated in 1968.

Local art displayed

The works of five Lane County artists are currently on display in the Eugene office of Jim Weaver, Fourth District Congressman, on the second floor of the Federal Building.

All five artists are employed through the Lane Regional Arts Council with funds made available through the federal CETA program. The Arts Council has six visual artists and five performing ar-

Among the items on display in Weaver's office are three "soft" sculptures by Celeste LeBlanc, paintings by Gary Buckendorf and Stephen Bangs and a "body-print" of Bobby Hogard.

The Lane Regional Arts Council artists are also working on a new mural for exterior south wall of the Fifth Street Public Market.
