

Bakke rally this weekend

A statewide demonstration opposing the Bakke Decision will be held Saturday in Portland. The

The Portland demonstration is part of nationwide activities against the Bakke decision and against increasing attacks on minority people.

Disarmament activist honors UNICEF Day

Disarmament for Survival will be the subject of a speech by peace activist Seldon Osborne Sunday in the parlor of Central Presbyterian Church on 14th Avenue and Patterson Street as part of the UNICEF-UN Day celebration from 2 to 4 p.m.

The celebration is sponsored by the Unitarian Church and the task force for Mobilization for Survival. Mobilization is a national and local campaign involving peace, anti-nuclear environmental organizations and church groups, which will culminate with a focus on the special session on disarmament at the United Nations in May and June, 1978.

Osborne is a political science graduate of Stanford University. He was part of the Continental Walk for Disarmament and Social Justice in 1976, speaking of his concerns for a national position supporting disarmament.
