Masters classes will be offered today beginning at 4 p.m. at the Western Oregon School of Ballet, 2649 Willamette St. Cost is \$4.

Two concerts in Eugene are set for Sheldon High School on Oct. 21, and Beall Hall on Oct. 22. Cur-

tain time for both concerts is 8 p.m.

Tickets may be purchased in advance at Meier & Frank, EMU, or by mail through the Lane Regional Arts Council office. Ducats will also be sold at the door prior to performances.

Ballet Folk performs traditional selections, but its specialty is the American Repertoire — ballets inspired by legends, literature, music and history of America. The scheduled performance will display classic ballet and original American selections.

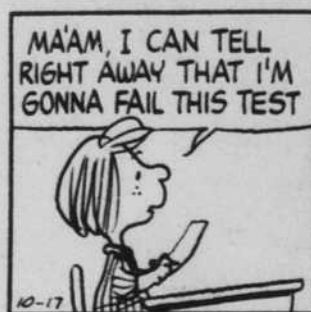
