

Flu shots to be available

Flu shots will be given at the University Health Center Wednesday from 8 to 11 p.m. and 1 to 4 p.m.

The vaccine contains type A Victoria and Type B Hong Kong strains, which were considered epidemic a few years ago.

A single injection should be sufficient for immunization. There have been very few reactions to this vaccine, although persons may experience a fever or sore

arm after the shot.

Cost of the shot will be \$1 for students and \$2 for faculty and staff.

Persons who are pregnant or have an allergy to chicken, eggs or feathers should consult their physicians before taking the influenza injections.

Those persons with an active infection or acute respiratory illness should delay their vaccine until recovery.
