....register it and show you care

If you haven't taken advantage of registering your bicycle at the campus security table in the EMU, here are three good reasons why you should

- It increases the chance that your bike can be tracked down, if stolen.
- Unregistered bicycles may be impounded by Security officers.
- Bike permits are being provided free this week during "Bike Registration Week." By taking ad-

vantage of the service, bike owners can avoid the \$2 licensing fees required by the city police.

Kelly McKirdy, coordinator of bicycle patrol, says students are taking advantage of the service at about 100 persons an hour.

Students should bring their bike's serial number and frame size with them to registration.

A pamphlet explaining University parking regulations for bikes also will be available at registration. When security officers find a

bike parked illegally, they may impound it.

Last year, 124 bikes were reported stolen and some 20 per cent were returned. But if the bike isn't registered, chances of recovery are slim, McKirdy says.

The free registration will be available from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. today in the main lobby of the EMU. The registration service will move to the dormitories Tuesday and Friday.

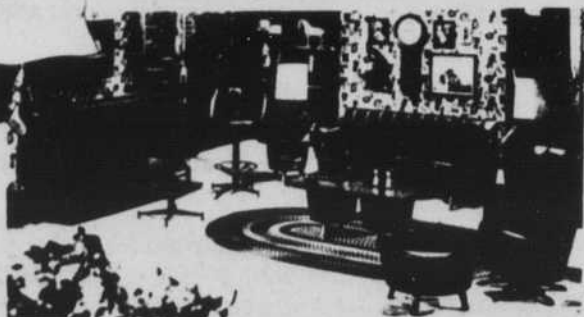
