Student Press rights addressed

Jack Hart, assistant professor of journalism, will deliver an 11 a.m. keynote address on student press rights and responsibilities during the 51st annual Oregon High School Press Conference Friday in the EMU.

Hart's speech will deal with recent developments in the legal field affecting the rights of student journalists.

Student press rights are unformed Hart said, because they have only been brought to issue since the Vietnam war while there have been 200 years of decisions affecting the commercial press.

More than 500 students and advisers are expected to attend the all-day event which features 500 workshops and nearly every phase of high school and junior high school journalism.

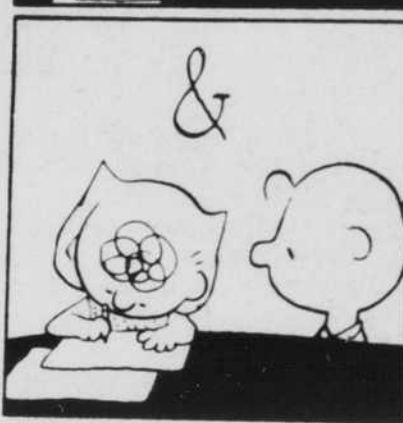
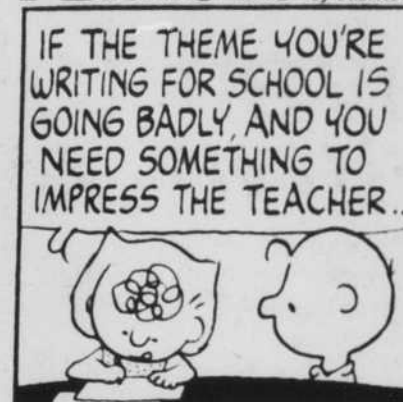
Delegates also will hear a high school principal and a former high school newspaper editor debate a censorship case currently on appeal in Fairfax County, Vir. Debaters are Bert Simmons, principal at North Eugene High School, and Wayne Bush, University freshman and former newspaper editor at West Albany High School.

Forty students are registered for two photography workshops to be conducted by assistant professor of journalism, Duncan McDonald.

Other workshops will deal with news, sports, editorial and feature writing, yearbook copy writing and layout, advertising techniques and staff leadership.

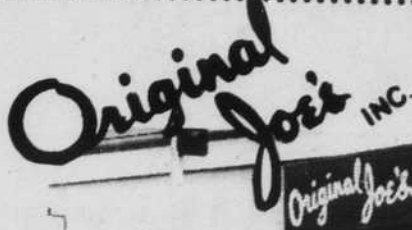
