

'Y' offers three classes

Three adult classes begin this week at the Eugene Family YMCA. "Get Fit to Ski," "Y's Way to a Healthy Back" and "Smoking Control" will be offered at 2055 Patterson St.

"Get Fit to Ski" is a conditioning class designed to focus on the muscles used in skiing.

The class, which is limited to 40 people, will meet on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. beginning today. Fee for the six week session is \$5 for Y members and \$15 for non-Y members.

"Y's Way to a Healthy Back" is a special exercise class designed by the national YMCA.

The class will also be offered on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 7 to 8 p.m. beginning today and lasting for six weeks.

Bernhard gains grant

A University chemist has been awarded \$50,000 by the National Science Foundation (NSF) to continue studying how various enzymes accelerate the process of metabolism.

Sidney Bernhard, a research associate in the University's Institute of Molecular Biology, said he will use the \$50,000 — the third installment of a five-year, \$250,000 NSF grant — to investigate the mechanism through which enzymes act as catalysts for chemical reactions in living organisms.
