Biologist nets 3 year grant

University biologist Roderick Capaldi has been awarded a three-year grant of \$173,400 from the U.S. Public Health Service for an ongoing study of mitochondrial membranes in heart tissue which help the body extract energy from food.

Capaldi, a research associate in the University Institute of Molecular Biology, said one goal of his work is to develop a model illustrating how molecules which make up the membranes are arranged.

The Oregon Heart Association, the National Science Foundation and the American Heart Association also provide support for the project.

Winter courses offered

Northwest Outward Bound is enrolling students in 21-day winter mountaineering courses to be held from January through mid-April in the Wallowa Mountains of Northeastern Oregon and the North Cascades of Washington and Canada.

The courses provide instruction in cross-country skiing, winter camping and winter peak climbing skills.


