Early color pix at gallery

Arthur Siegal, patriarch of one of the country's best known photography programs, will exhibit a collection of his early color work at the Photography at Oregon Gallery, University Museum of Art, today through Dec. 18.

Siegal is head of the photography department of the Institute of Technology, Chicago, Ill. He has been connected with the Institute for 40 years.

Siegal's show includes color prints taken while doing documentary photography for the Farm Security Administration between 1936-1942. Also shown will be Siegal's photographs, taken while a student in 1937 at the New Bauhaus in Chicago.
