The National Research Council will again advise the National Science Foundation in the selection of candidates for the Foundation's National Needs Postdoctoral Fellowships.

Panels of scientists and engineers appointed by the research council will evaluate applications of all candidates. The deadline date to submit applications is Dec. 5.

Approximately 140 fellowships will be awarded for research and study on scientific problems related to national needs in the mathematical, physical, medical, biological, engineering and social sciences.

The basic stipend for fellows is \$1,000 per month and will be awarded to persons who have earned a Ph.D. in one of the fields of science or have had research training and experience equivalent to that degree.

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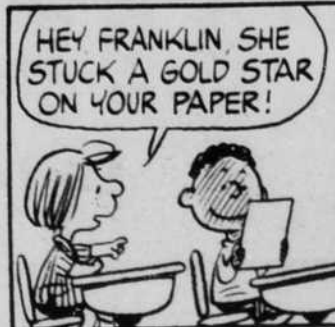
