Ship mail embargo lifted

The embargo on surface (ship) mail to many overseas destinations has been lifted, according to Eugene Postmaster Ethan Newman.

The end of the embargo came too late to rely on surface mail for the shipping of Christmas packages and cards overseas this season, says Dixie Kruger, customer services representative for the Eugene Post Office. She says overseas gifts and cards should be sent by airmail to assure delivery before Christmas.

The Postal Service placed the embargo on surface mail on Oct. 2, because of a dock strike on the East and Gulf coasts. It prevented many people from sending Christmas gifts and cards to friends and relatives in overseas locations.

Composer to visit campus

Ernst Krenek, internationally known composer, will be on the University campus Sunday and Monday.

Krenek will take part in a panel discussion on contemporary American music Sunday at 3 p.m. in Beall Concert Hall. On Monday, Krenek will meet with students and faculty of the University.

The highlights of Krenek's visit to the University will be the Oregon Symphonic Wind Ensemble concert, in which he will conduct a new work for bands commissioned by the College Band Directors National Association.

Robert Vagner, retiring music school professor, will conduct the Ensemble in the remainder of the program. The performance will be the last for the Ensemble under Vagner's direction.

Krenek was born in Vienna in 1900. He was one of the leading musicians in Europe before he came to the United States in 1937. After arriving, he taught at several universities and continued composing and lecturing.

There will be no admission charge for the panel discussion or the concert.
