Women pour it on for sixth straight win, 103-59

Southern Oregon falls victim to record

The Oregon women's basketball squad won its sixth straight game Saturday night, smothering a much out-manned Southern Oregon State College team 103-59.

Five players finished the offensively-dominated game in double-figures for the Ducks. Leading the way was freshman forward Debbie Adams who totaled a game-high 26 points, most of them from close range. Newcomer Shannon Kelly followed close behind with 20 counters and added a game-high 14 rebounds.

A pleased Elwin Heiny, Oregon head coach, explained later that the game had given his team the opportunity to work on aspects of their game that they had done poorly on, or hadn't encountered

previously in their undefeated season.

"We really needed to practice our press," said Heiny. "It hasn't worked at all so far this year for us."

And practice they did. Pressing for the majority of the second half, the taller and quicker Ducks took advantage of 42 Red Raider turnovers, scoring 59 second half points to break the century mark.

The 103 points scored by Oregon was a new school scoring record for the women and one which was thoroughly enjoyed by almost everyone present at Mac Court. Almost everyone.

One person who didn't get too much of a kick out of watching the Ducks piling up the points was Southern Oregon head coach Al

Akins. Akins registered his displeasure with Heiny's tactics by making two visits to the Oregon bench during the waning minutes of play, neither one having to do with the number of towels his team would be allotted after the game for showers.

Heiny later insisted that he wasn't trying to pour it on, but rather allowing his team the necessary work they need to spend on their game before a tough road trip through the state of Washington next weekend.

"Next week we play Washington and Western Washington," he said. "I don't know exactly what to expect from them but I do know that those are definitely the top two teams in the league."

One exceptionally bright spot

for the Ducks on a night of many, was the play of the 5-10 sophomore Kelly. Kelly, the Ducks leading rebounder a year ago, was playing in her first game this season and did a great job coming off the bench to help shoot up the Red Raider's zone defense.

"I was nervous before the game," explained Kelly about her return, "but once I got playing I felt pretty good."

Kelly's arrival comes none too soon for the Ducks after learning that they will miss the services of Becky Paschke, their second leading scorer, for at least four games.

Paschke has been temporarily suspended by the UO Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Advisory Council due to a discrepancy in

her fall-term eligibility and cannot be reinstated until her case is reviewed by the Ethics and Eligibility Committee of the Northwest College Women's Sports Association. The 5-10 sophomore had been averaging 17 points and 5.2 rebounds per game.

Along with Kelly, Heiny pointed to the play of two other new faces on the Oregon squad — Peggy Shekell and Patrice Thrasher — as promising.

"They still have things to learn," Heiny said about the new additions to the team. "But still they played extremely well tonight for being out less than a week."

Flying Ducks' string now 25 with wins in Wheaton Classic

Oregon's gymnastics team continued its string of dual meet wins in top fashion over the weekend, defeating No. 5 ranked LSU along with Illinois and Wheaton in a four-way meet held in Chicago.

The Flying Ducks' closest competition came against the Tigers, the team that last beat Oregon in a dual meet two years ago. Jim Kelch tied in the all-around Ron Gallimore, LSU's top gymnast and winner on the floor exercise over Oregon's Don Lester in the NCAA meet a year ago, to lead the Ducks to the win.

Top performances for Oregon were a 9.6 on the pommel horse by Tom Truedson, a 9.55 on the rings by Scott McEldowney, and Kelch's all-around score of 52.45.
