**Senate to consider motion**

The University Senate will consider a motion concerning faculty elections today at 3:30 p.m. in 229 Law.

The motion, submitted by an ad hoc committee on terms, recommends that the Faculty Advisory Council and the Faculty Personnel Committee each be enlarged to eight members as of this spring's elections.

The four persons receiving the most votes would serve two-year terms, and the remaining four would have one-year terms.

The motion further stipulates that no members of the University administration including vice, assistant and associate provosts, be permitted to serve on either body.
