The series will be at 7:30 p.m. Thursdays, beginning today. The location has been changed to Laurelwood Recreation Building, 2700 Columbia St.

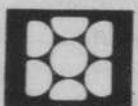
The series is sponsored by the Eugene Parks and Recreation Department. A \$1 admission will be charged.

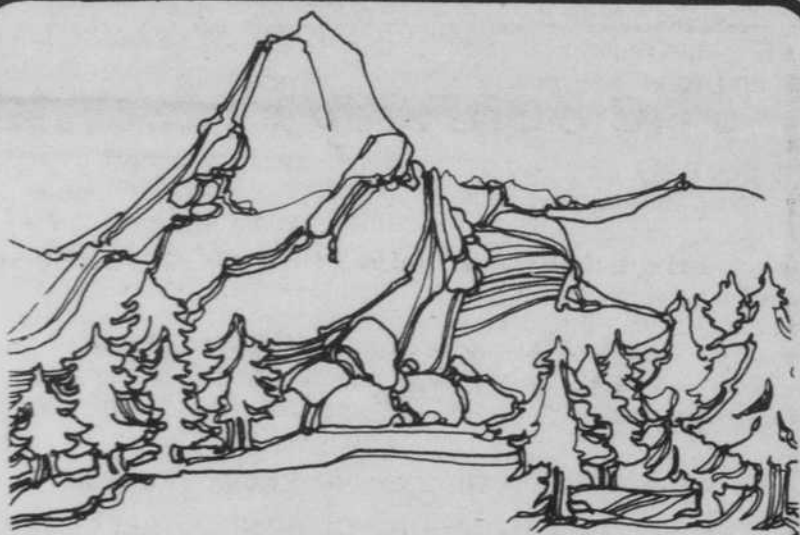
