Book documents Oregon folklore

Suzie Jones, doctoral candidate and folk art coordinator for the Oregon Arts Commission, has put together a unique scrapbook for Oregonians.

"Oregon Folklore" offers a broad sampling of the many arts, crafts, beliefs and folkways practiced by Oregonians in every region of the state.

"There's a sort of man-in-the-street notion that folklore means things that are backward or old-fashioned. People are often embarrassed about it," Jones says. "I'm trying to show that there's nothing to be embarrassed about, and it's not necessarily backwards. All of us have a lot of customs and traditions that we follow."

Jones' book was chosen by the University of Oregon Centennial Planning Council as a way to honor the heritage of Oregon and the University. As a bicentennial field researcher in Oregon for the Smithsonian Institute, Jones has watched folklore awareness grow on the national level.

"I had an English professor once who talked to us about ignoring the local culture around us," Jones recalls. "But I thought it unfair because at the same time the college itself was ignoring it. They didn't offer any classes in folklore."

Jones explored folklore independently, by taking reading and conference courses and doing field work projects related to her growing interest in the subject. When she came to do graduate work at the University, courses from folklore professor Barre Toelken supplemented her research efforts.

Toelken, who wrote the introduction for the book is using it as a resource for his Introduction to Folklore and Mythology class.

"Oregon Folklore" documents the types of agrarian work still done by many persons across the state. Bits of Indian legend, the customs and crafts of several ethnic groups like Mexican Americans and Scandinavians, and Russian "old believers" liven up the portrait of Oregon's folk experience.

Jones, who started collecting superstitions earlier in her career, also includes a chapter in storytelling.

"The book is designed with the general public in mind," she says. "I hope people will read it and just become more aware of their folklore."

Copies of the book are available at Book and Tea and the Id bookstore. All proceeds from sales will go to support the Randall V. Mills Archives of Northwest Folklore here at the University.
