

Still kinks in land-use planning proposal

Lane County's land-use planning effort has a few kinks yet to be worked out, according to participants in Wednesday night's meeting between the Lane County Commissioners and the Lane County Planning Commission.

Balancing the plan with state goals, educating the public as to what land-use planning is and involving the public in the planning process were goals voiced at the meeting.

Commissioner Jerry Rust proposed a similar program last year as Phase 3 of the land-use planning effort. Although Phase 3

as such was not discussed, Rust said the voiced objectives were the same.

John Thomas, chairer of the Lane County Planning Commission, said he felt taxes should reflect land-use objectives more.

Rust agreed it wasn't fair to reward developers, (through tax breaks), while not rewarding people who want to hold onto their land and preserve open spaces.

Commissioner Bob Wood suggested lobbying against inheritance taxes. "It isn't fair that corporations don't have to pay it and families do," he said. Wood said the Legislature doesn't understand the problems of family taxation.

Joan Rich, of the planning commission, said it was wrong to expect people to know what was happening in their area simply by inserting a notice in the newspaper. She suggested mailing letters to those people whose property could be affected by a proposal and advising them of the public hearing.

Wood said people must be educated about land use and told why it's necessary. "In every city, including Seattle, the average income is being eroded. People are leaving the city," he said.

Wood agreed that a need for public input on land-use planning exists. However, he said a structured program is necessary.

Dennis Cuddeback, a member of the planning commission, suggested information pamphlets be made for the public on land-use planning. He said people are "frustrated" and need a place to go to be informed.

Cuddeback, Suzanne Boyd and Joan Rich, all of the planning commission, volunteered to study possible ways to educate and involve the public.

Other land-use planning problems were also discussed. Rust said energy and economic goals had not really been addressed. Commissioner Archie Weinstein said he wasn't satisfied with the method of assigning agricultural zoning.
