The Oregon Department of Geology and Mineral Industries has made a second \$10,000 grant to extend a University study of Mt. Hood as a potential source of geothermal energy.

University geology professor Alexander McBirney said that the first phase of the study, begun last fall, proved promising enough for the state to fund additional research.

The project has two goals, according to researcher Craig White. One is to assess whether Timberline Lodge might be heated geothermally and the second is to find a high temperature heat source.

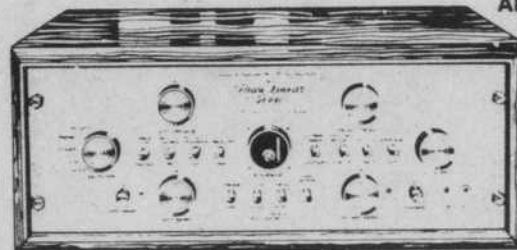
