Economic historian Wolfram Fischer will lecture at the University Monday at 3 p.m. in the EMU, room to be posted.

Fischer, director of the Institute for Economic and Social History at the Free University of Berlin, will speak on "The German Economy in the 20th Century: Continuity and Change."

Fischer is teaching this term at Stanford University. His talk is free and open to the public.

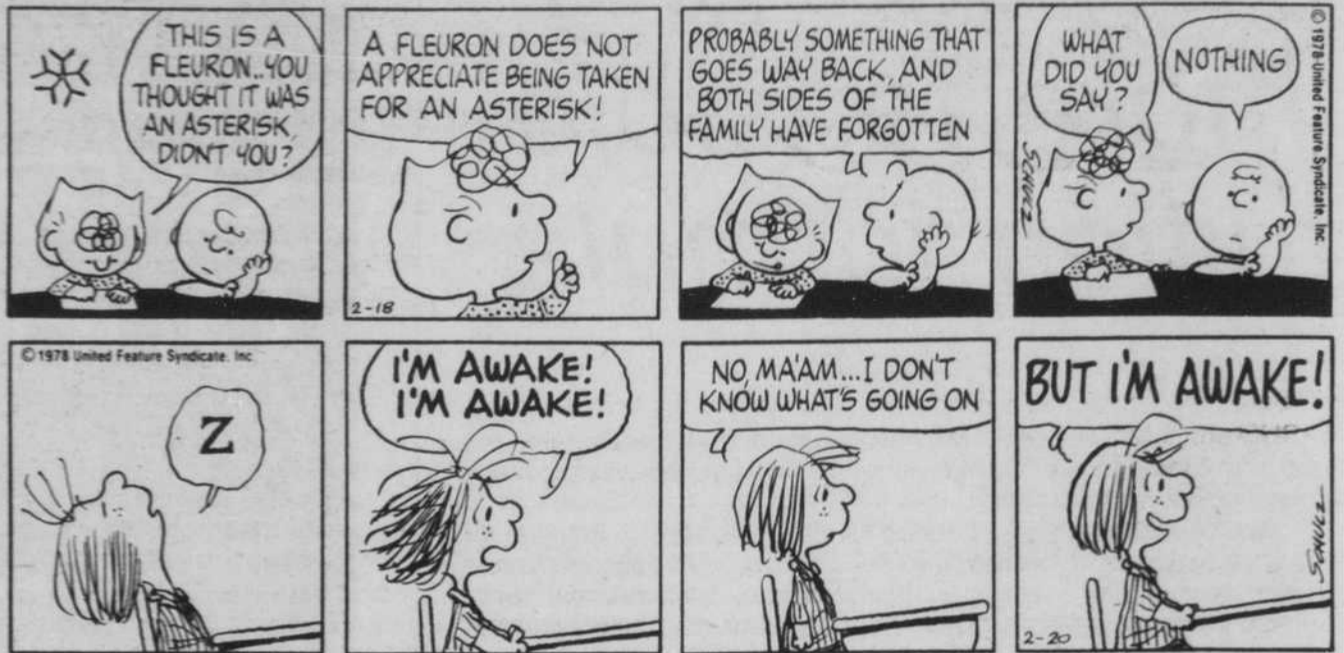
Best known for her sculptured works, Benglis has exhibited in
