His talk is sponsored by the University Department of Architecture and will be open free to the public.

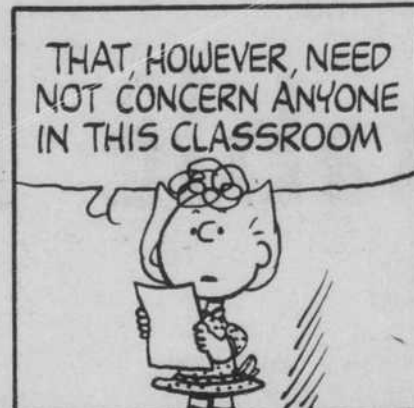
Yoga monk talks on meditation

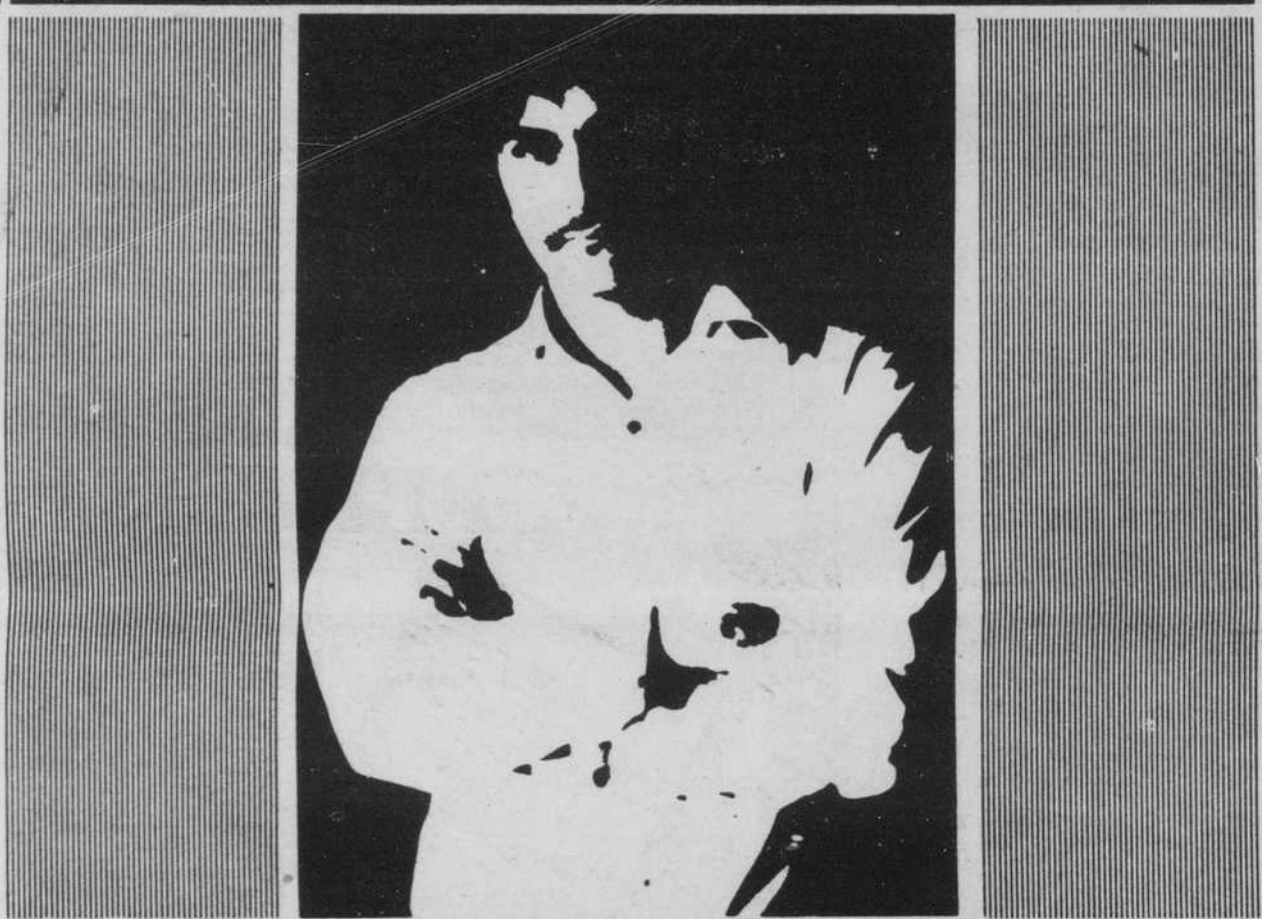
