

Health questions answered

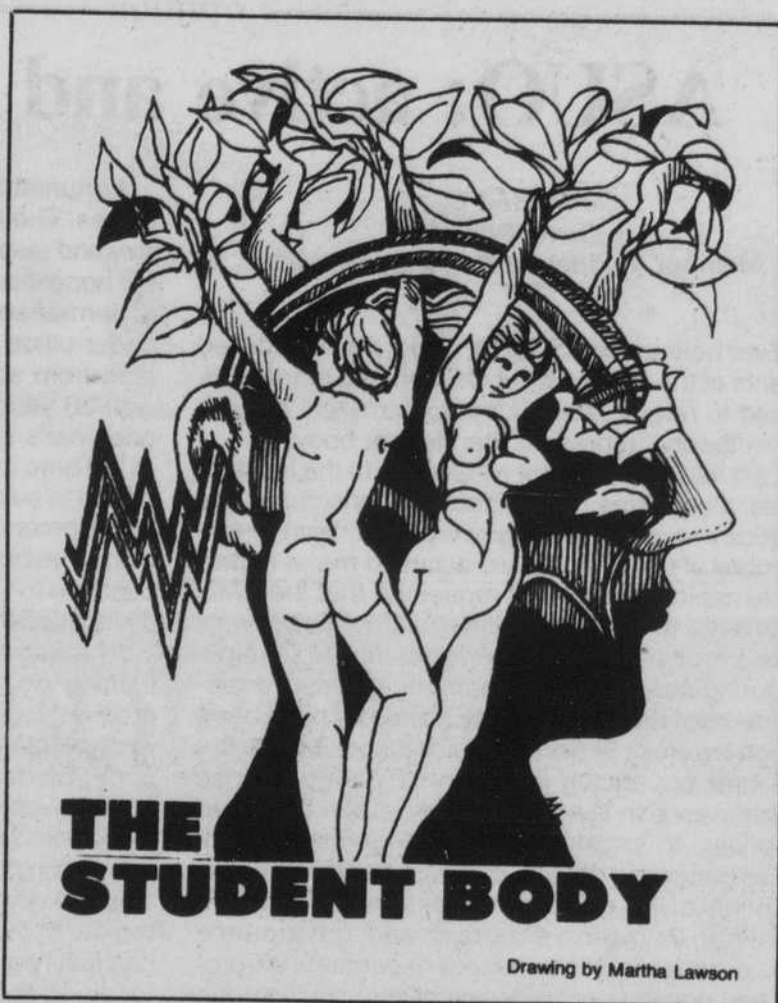
Editor's Note: Three graduate students in health education who work at the University Student Health Center will answer your medical questions every other Wednesday in the Emerald.

If you have a question you'd like answered concerning you or your family's medical problems, just jot it down and send it in care of the health center or the Emerald.

The University Health Center provides more than just medical care to its students — it now offers the services of student consultants and counselors.

Three currently enrolled masters candidates work six hours a week to counsel students with conditions requiring explanations before formal treatment is administered or as a followup to medical treatment.

Nurse Trudy Bernard provides information on personal and family health problems, special disease conditions, communicable diseases, skin conditions



and general areas of preventative health care.

Another counselor, Willette Rude, a nutritionist and diet therapist, offers guidance in basic nutrition, required diet therapy principles, weight control and other special dietary restrictions.

Family Planner Marsha

Serling helps with basic family planning, birth control methods, venereal diseases, pregnancy testing and preventive dental care.

Interested students should call the appointment desk at 686-4441. The consultants have regularly scheduled office hours.

Public comments made and included during the reviewing stage can modify a final EIS report.

The ESC also keeps a file of individuals and groups that have expertise in various environmental areas. It makes three to five referrals a week, and the number is increasing.

How does the referral service work?

"For example," Hamilton explains, "A woman...called last week about clear-cutting screwing up her water supply. We gave her the names of six lawyers who could handle it."

"A role that has been thrust on us in the absense of an environmental studies curriculum is an informal advising capacity about

environmentally related courses," says Hamilton.

The center gets about two written and two verbal requests for course information per week, including requests from other universities. It puts out a free catalog of environmental studies that lists environmental groups and courses related to the environment that are offered at the University.

Outside the ESC is a bulletin board with notices about jobs in environmentally related fields, public meetings, conferences and public hearings.

The ESC is located in Room 11, OLC, ext. 5006. The center is now open the following hours: Monday and Friday — 8 a.m.-noon, 1-4 p.m., Tuesday — 1-9:30 p.m., Wednesday — 8 a.m.-noon, and Thursday — 1-8:30 p.m.
