Faculty extends deadline period for incompletes

The University Assembly passed a motion that changes the policy
for removal of incompletes from student records at Wednesday's meet-
ing.

As of fall term 1978, incompletes must be made up no later than
three calendar years or within three terms of residency at the University
from the time the course was taken.

Previously, students had only one term following graduation to
make up any incompletes.

According to the motion, the new restriction does not apply to
incompletes given pending completion of research projects, theses or
terminal projects.

The motion also amends the present rules so that instructors will be
required to file a statement setting forth the conditions under which the
"I" would be removed.

Also there is an outside boundary of three years to remove incom-
pletes. The grade can be changed at an earlier date if the instructor,
dean or department head so specifies.

The assembly decided also to formally discuss and act upon a
proposal for a tri-University education doctorate. This will insure that
decisions concerning innovative degree requirements and curriculum
proposals will remain in the faculty's jurisdiction.

Pres. William Boyd spoke briefly to the assembly about faculty pay
increases and the University library.

He said that in September there would be a 3 percent across-the-
board salary increase for all faculty members whose work was
deemed satisfactory.

Boyd said that talk of a central storage system for state system
libraries has produced anxiety among many faculty members, particu-
larly those in the humanities, but he assured the faculty that no such
decision would be implemented without extensive consideration of
alternatives and future needs.

"We shall resist any solution until the faculty has enough time to
study the question," he said.

Boyd will appoint an ad hoc faculty committee to probe the matter.
