

...Of environmental concern

The U.S. House of Representatives' Agriculture Committee has asked for a Forest Service budget increase of \$421 million more than Pres. Carter requested.

The committee's budget task force adopted a motion made by Jim Weaver, D-Ore., Forestry Subcommittee chair calling for the increase.

"The lion's share of this increase would go for reforestation, timber stand improvement and timber sales preparation," Weaver said.

"Our future timber supply depends on two things: the trees we plant today, and how intensively we manage our existing timber stands. We can't put off any longer the essential job of restocking our forests," he added.

The first full-member meeting of the Eugene-Springfield Air Quality Maintenance Area Citizen's Advisory Committee is scheduled for Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.

A joint resolution signed by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Eugene Springfield and Lane County created the 25-member committee.

It will recommend to the DEQ and the Lane Regional Air Pollution Authority control strategy to bring the

area back into compliance with federal clean air standards for total suspended particulates, such as those caused by field burning.

The meeting, open to the public, will be held in the Commissioner's Conference Room in the Lane County Public Service Building at 125 E. 8th St.

The Pebble Springs nuclear power plant may face further delays because Pacific Power and Light Company's (PP&L) testimony on its future energy needs is insufficient, according to Oregon's top energy official.

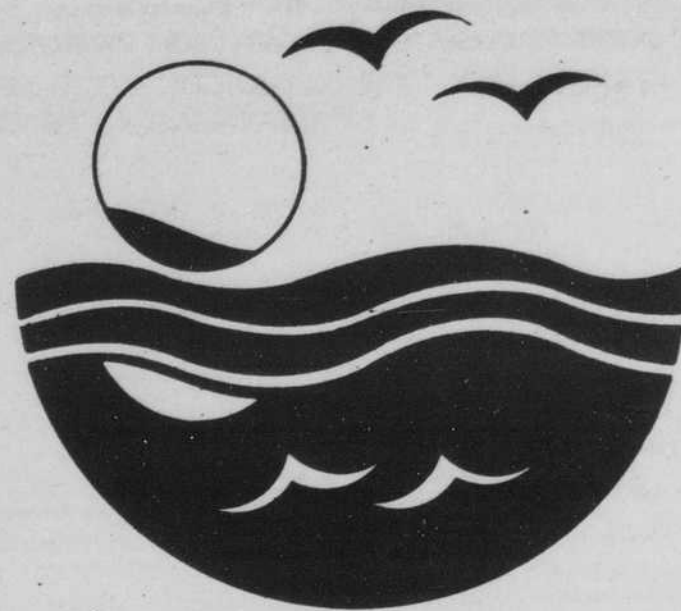
Fred Miller, director of the state Department of Energy, said last week his agency is asking the Oregon Energy Facility Siting Council to exclude the PP&L testimony on its future needs.

The council's hearings on site certification for the two proposed eastern Oregon plants have already been postponed from January until next June.

Miller said PP&L, in predicting its future requirements, did not detail how its energy conservation and alternate-resource programs would affect energy consumption.

If PP&L does not revise its presentation, the future of the project might be endangered, Miller said.

A spokesperson for the utility said PP&L will probably ask the council to accept revised testimony that should resolve Miller's objection.



Increased citizen participation in Department of Forestry activities will be discussed at a State Board of Forestry meeting in Salem, Wednesday.

Concern about increasing citizen input has led the board to hold more meetings away from Salem. The results of committee meetings held in Corvallis, Astoria and Roseburg last month will be discussed.

A forest recreation report, the identification of under-productive western Oregon forest lands and the proposed 1979-81 Forestry department goals and budget are also on the agenda.

The meeting will be held in the Protection Building Conference Room in the State Forester's Office, 2600 State St., at 10 a.m.
