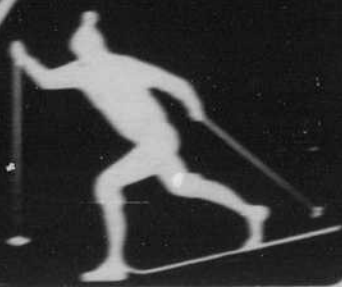

**Exemption test slated in health**

Students who have a good background in health may take a health proficiency exam, and a passing grade in the test will exempt them from taking the health course needed to meet graduation requirements. It, however, does not give them credits in the course.

Students must sign up in Room 250 Esslinger, Health Education Office, to take the test to be given during the registration period.

Tests may be taken only once. This exam is based on course content commonly included in basic health courses in Oregon universities. It covers 10 general areas including general health and health care, communicable and degenerative diseases, family health, nutrition, mental health and illness, drugs, consumer health and care, community health, environmental health and sanitation, accident prevention and first aid.

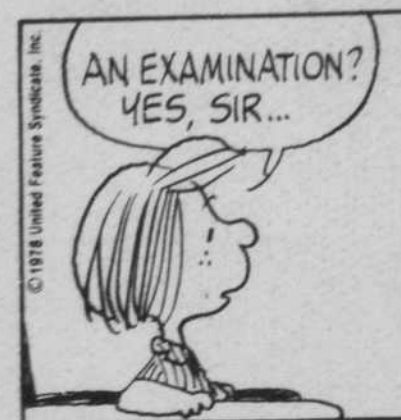
