Parenting skills is the topic for a series of classes scheduled by the Lane County Health Division.

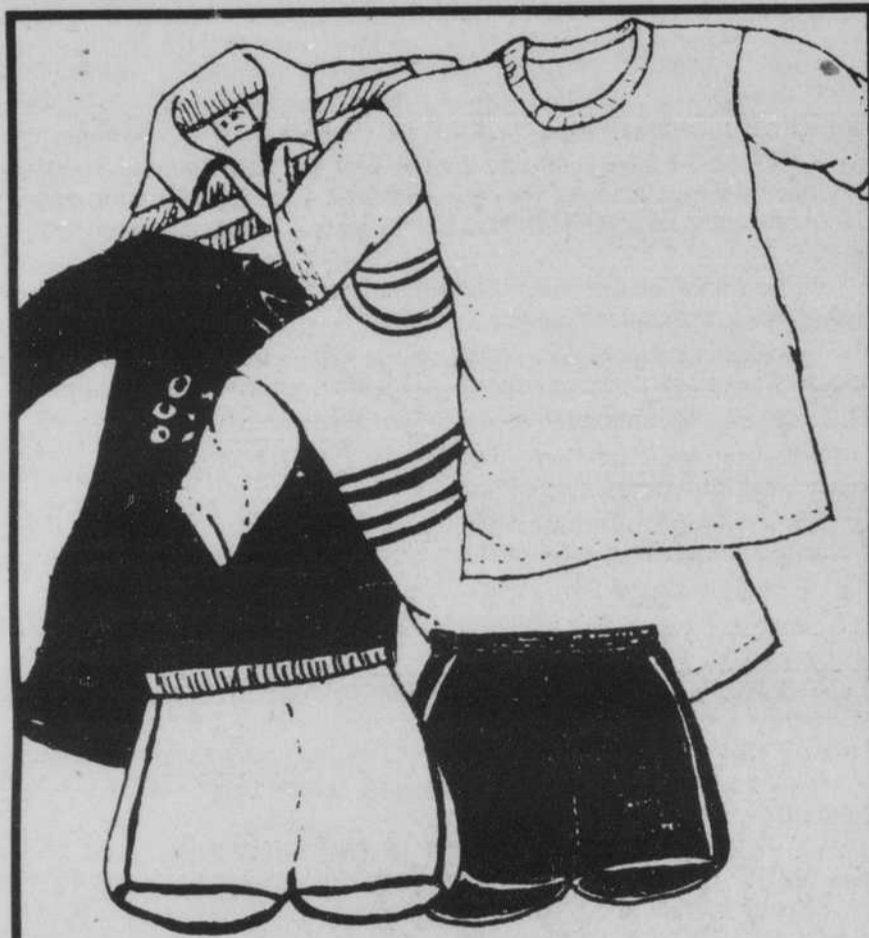
Parents of young children are invited to share their experiences and learn new options and techniques for dealing with troublesome behavior.

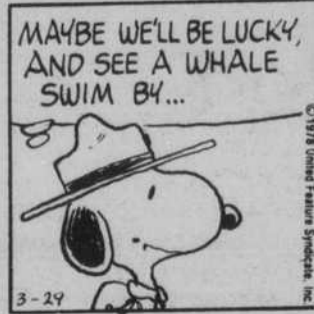
