"Paper as Art," a show of works made by creating and manipulating paper and paper pulp, will be shown at the Northside Gallery today through April 12.

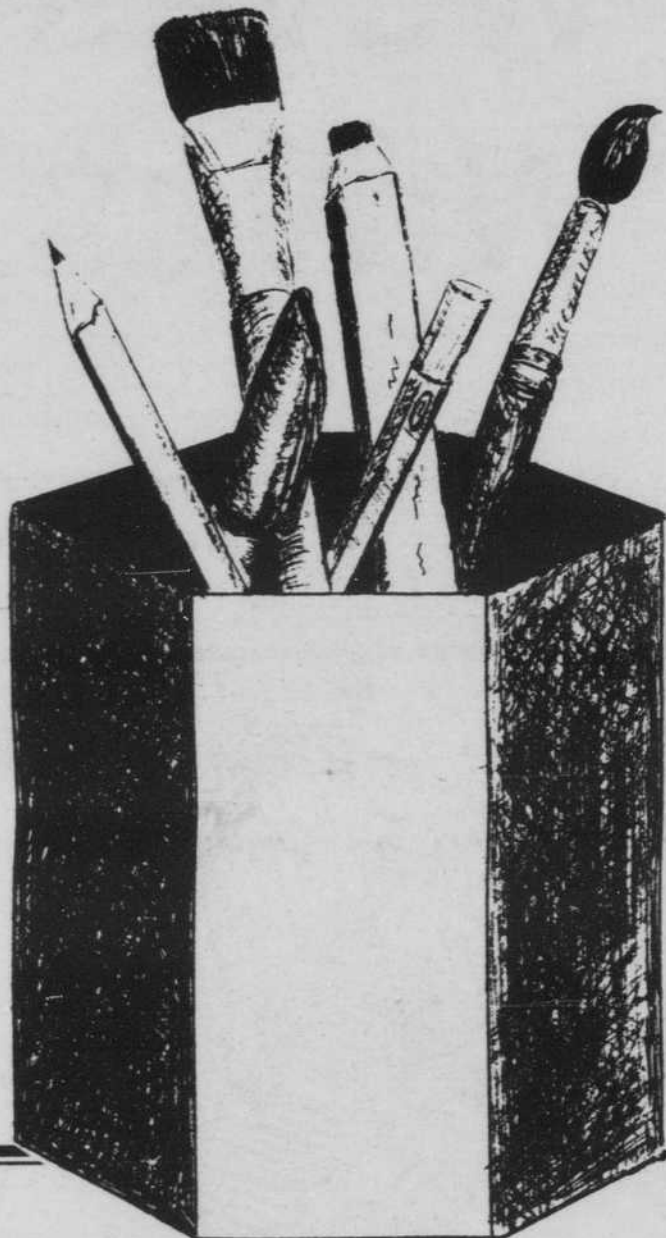

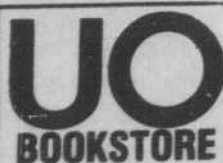

Registration begins the first day of class. Persons may join the class any time during the term.

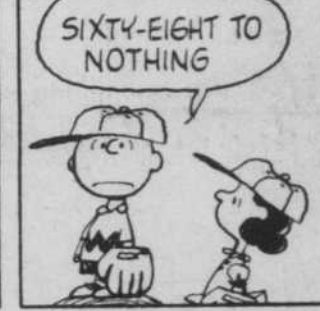
Babysitting and textbooks are included in the tuition.
