Skits mock nuclear power

The Trojan Decommissioning Alliance sponsored a rally and parade Saturday in Eugene to protest the Eugene Water and Electric Board's 30 percent ownership of the Trojan Nuclear Power Plant.

About 250 people joined the brightly costumed marchers who began their journey at noon from the Lane County Courthouse. The protesters sang anti-nuclear songs, played music and performed skits along the way.

A wooden replica of the Trojan Horse led the group onward in the wind and rain making stops at the Eugene mall and the Saturday Market. Cynthia

Wooten, an aide to 4th District Congressman Jim Weaver, and Emily Ashworth, a Democratic governor's candidate also participated in the events.

The group is pushing for divestment of the St. Helena plant shared because, it says, Trojan not only doesn't meet any electricity needs of Eugene consumers, but could cost them a great deal in increased rates if the plant is shut down.

TDA predicts that such a shutdown would increase EWEB rates by an immediate minimum of 70 percent through 1982, with another increase of 10 percent that year.
