Ducks face powerful UCLA for their toughest track test yet

This weekend is a big one for athletics at the University with the NCAA gymnastics championships in McArthur Court, but track coach Bill Dellinger will be concerned with the action at Hayward Field Saturday afternoon, where the Ducks take on the strong UCLA Bruins.

UCLA, second-ranked a year ago, has a lot for fire-power in its track team. So much that Dellinger called every event "crucial"

to the success of his team. There are a few events he is ready to concede to the Bruins — the 400 and mile relays, pole vault, long and triple jumps and the javelin.

Oregon's top pole vaulter Tom Hintnaus is a big question mark for the meet because of injuries suffered when he missed the vaulting pit during a jump Monday. He was taken to the hospital unconscious but suffered no serious injuries. Dellinger said Hintnaus has been jogging since the incident and it will be determined today if he can vault.

Even if Hintnaus does vault, he will be no competition for UCLA's Mike Tully, who is one of the world's best pole vaulters.

Oregon also doesn't have anyone who can come close to UCLA's Ted DeMill in the javelin. The closest a Duck has come to DeMill is Ron Perkin's 223-3/2.

In the triple and long jumps, Dellinger said the Bruins are "quite a ways ahead of our jumpers." UCLA's star, Willie Banks, has gone nearly a foot-and-a-half longer than Oregon's Jon Ogard, and is also the Bruins' best triple jumper.

The Ducks have closed the gap which used to separate UCLA and Oregon in the sprints. Although UCLA has 1976 Olympic 100 meter silver medalist Millard Hampton and Gregory Foster, the Ducks can answer with a couple of speed merchants of their own. Andrew Banks and Don Coleman will give Hampton and Foster a real run for their money in the 100 and 200.

Banks has the season's fastest time in the 100 among the quartet at 10.3, with Hampton and Foster 2-3 and Coleman fourth. In the 200, Hampton and Coleman both have the season's best mark of 21.1.

"We're close enough so they could go 1-2 or we could go 1-2," Dellinger said.

Nonetheless, Dellinger feels his team has a good shot at beating the Bruins on Saturday.

"It's going to take a total team effort with a few breaks, said Dellinger. "In those events which could go either way, we have to go 1-2. We need to go 1-2 in the 1500 and we need to sweep the 5000...In the shot they have a 62 footer (Dave Laut) but we're capable of going 1-3 or 1-2."

Jeff Stover threw the shot 63 feet last weekend and the Ducks have two more shot putters in the 58 foot range, Dave Voorhees and Vince Goldsmith.

Women tackle Falcons in equally tough meet

In a match with what could be the best dual meet team in the country with a leading contender for the AIAW national championship, Oregon's women's track team will host Seattle Pacific Saturday at Hayward Field.

The Falcons are a traditional power in women's track in the Northwest, finishing second two years ago in the national and placing seventh last year.

"They are a quality team. They don't have the depth that we do but their individual performers are excellent," Oregon Coach Tom Heinonen said. "I think we're as good a dual meet team as there is in the country."

In order for Oregon to win, Heinonen says the Ducks will have to score big in the sprints and the relays. Seattle Pacific is awesome in the field events.

Pam Spencer and Theresa Smith both have international experience in the high jump. Spencer was a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team and has a personal best of 6'1/2". Smith has gone 5'11". Heinonen hopes

Kerry Clawson, who has jumped 5'8", can break the Falcons' apparent stronghold in that event.

In the weight events, Seattle Pacific boasts the threesome of Loma Griffin, Marcia Mecklenburg and Julie Hansen, all of whom have placed in the national meet. Griffin won the national discus title in 1976 and was runner-up last year. Mecklenburg was second in both the shot and the discus two years ago and placed sixth in the shot last year. Hansen was fifth in the discus in last year's national meet.

Oregon will counter with Mary Stevenson and Kathy Picknell in both the shot and discus. Maggie Bonn, Oregon's best shot putter, will contend with Griffen and Mecklenburg in that event.

Debbie Quatier, former American record holder at 5,000 meters will double in the distances for Seattle Pacific, running both the 3,000 and 1,500 meters. Ellen Schmidt will lead the Oregon contingent in the 1,500 and Heather Telford, Debbie Richie and Molly Morton will challenge Quatier in the 3,000.

The meet begins at noon.
